

SEELAND SWITZERLAND'S LARGEST VEGETABLE GARDEN

The Seeland which lies between Lake Murten, Lake Neuchâtel and Lake Biel and is spread over the cantons of Bern, Fribourg and Neuchâtel is fertile ground, in more ways than one. Two water corrections, the first in 1868, made it possible to reclaim the once swampy land. The black soil of the former alluvial plain is very nutrient-rich, making it ideal for growing vegetables. Today, more than 60 different varieties of vegetable are grown in the region, earning Seeland the title of Switzerland's largest vegetable garden. Ever more producers are shifting to organio to preserve the fertility of the soil in the long term and meet rising consumer demand.

In 2022, the regional development project 'Bio-Gemüse Seeland' was launched to foster regional cooperation and value-added agriculture. One strand of the project focuses on turning Seeland's organic vegetable production into a visitor experience and raising consumer awareness of sustainability, quality and regionality. It has already developed three tourist activities: the culinary tour 'Organic delights in Murten'; the Seeland 'Organic Vegetable Day'; and the Seeland 'Bio-Trail' which will open in 2024. Produce sold in a growing number of farm shops bear the 'PASSION SEELAND bio:logique' label.

For SwitzerlandMobility (the Swiss network for non-motorised traffic), the Seeland region has proved fertile ground for sustainable mobility. The first slowUp, a project to encourage people to use their own muscle power to move, was launched on Lake Murten in the run-up to Expo.02. Since then, slowUp events regularly take place across the country. Several SwitzerlandMobility cycling, skating and hiking routes run through the region, such as the family-friendly Mittelland Route № 5. Another great attraction for visitors of all ages is the Papiliorama, in Kerzers, and its miniature indoor tropical forest full of exotic fauna. >>

Year-round – Discover over 60 species of butterfly and lots more exotic creatures in the jungle, above the treetops and in the mangrove swamp. In Nocturama, spot the jungle dwellers who only come out after dark. Explore the Central American rainforest in Jungle Trek and get to know our fourlegged friends at the petting zoo. Papiliorama offers year-round fun for everyone. ≫

New – Ever more Seeland vegetable producers are going organic. In addition to the two existing vegetable-themed trails (25 and 45 km), a fun and informative six-kilometre-long trail showcasing the region's organic credentials will launch in 2024. ≫

'ORGANIC VEGETABLE DAY'



Great day out – Kerzers, Galmiz and Fräschels host the annual 'Organic Vegetable Day' which showcases locally grown organic vegetables and their producers. Visitors can sample freshly picked produce and growers are on hand to explain how they maintain the fertility of the dark, nutrient-rich soil. There are always vegetables in season here: rhubarb and asparagus in spring; salads and summer veg in the warmer months; squash and cabbage in the autumn. A fun and mouth-watering walking or cycling trail for all ages. >>
